# Moments of disruption call for extraordinary leadership—ZICA President

She was speaking during the official opening of the Inaugural International Executive Retreat (IER) held at Avani Victoria Falls Resort in Livingstone from 12<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> May 2021 co-hosted by ZICA and the Institute of Chartered Accountants Malawi (ICAM).

"If we cling on to the old concept of leadership, our future is doomed. There is no such thing as getting back to the way life was. I dare say, those leaders who want to cling to the thought that there is "life as it was" to go back to, are going to be irrelevant going forward, Mrs. Zimba said.

The President therefore challenged the executives at the retreat to do away with their old models of leadership which 'if we cling to them, our future is doomed.' As leaders are being futuristic, Mrs. Zimba called for the emergence of a breed of leaders that would thrive on collaboration. She clarified: "We need leaders who are going to help us cooperate rather than competing. Competition as the life-blood of economies is a false concept. Cooperation is the life-blood.



This means we need leaders who are going to change our theories of economics. We are better when we realise we are in this together: Malawi, Zambia and all our neighbours."

The joint ICAM and ZICA executive retreat has demonstrated the futuristic leadership models the two institutions have begun to exercise at present.

The President further emphasised that, what COVID-19 had taught us was that success could not be for individual organisations and countries. "We have to re-learn to solve our problems together. Working as individual organisations and countries, we would not manage to solve the problem of COVID-19 and its resultant effects of destroyed economies, over-stretched healthcare system, and disrupted international travel, among many other aspects that make our lives meaningful" Mrs. Zimba said.
