STATEMENT ISSUED BY THE ZICA CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER, MR. ANTHONY BWEMBYA ON THE RELEASE OF THE JUNE 2025 ZICA EXAMINATIONS RESULTS

Ladies and gentlemen,

I am proud to announce that the results for the June 2025 ZICA examinations have been released.

Aligned with the Accountants Act of 2008, ZICA continues its mission to train and educate accountancy professionals who meet the progressive demands of various economic sectors. Our objective is to foster meaningful socio-economic development nationwide by producing market-ready accountants poised to drive innovation and growth across both public and private domains.

On behalf of the ZICA Council and Management, I extend our heartfelt gratitude to the administrators and lecturers from our approved tuition providers. Your unwavering collaboration was instrumental in the smooth administration of the June 2025 examinations. This partnership is greatly treasured. I look forward to our ongoing efforts in developing competent, work-ready accountants and business leaders—aligned with our vision of serving as a distinguished institution for finance and business professional development.

We also wish to commend the dedication and hard work of Institute staff and strategic partners involved in the examination process. Your commitment has ensured the prompt release of these results.

1.0 EXAMINATION ENTRIES

Let me begin by highlighting the key statistics from the June 2025 examination session.

A total of **4,844** registrations were received for the June 2025 session—an increase from **2,651** in March 2025.

Of the 4,844 registrations, 560 were absent from examinations (representing an absenteeism rate of 11.6%). I would like to take this opportunity to encourage all students to plan and prepare adequately through consistent study and attendance of tuition classes. It is essential that candidates fully utilize the examination opportunities they invest in, aligning with the values of financial prudence that are foundational to the accountancy profession.

Regarding gender representation, of the 4,284 candidates who sat for the June 2025 examinations, 2,392 (55.8%) were male and 1,892 (44.2%) were female. This represents a slight positive shift in gender balance, with a decrease in male participation from 58% in March 2025 and a corresponding increase in female participation from 42%.

2.0 PERFORMANCE

A highlight of the performance of the candidates that sat for the June 2025 Examinations was as follows:

Overall Pass Rates

During the June 2025 examination session, compared to the previous session, it was observed that the overall pass rate for the CA Application Advanced Diploma, both levels of the Diploma in Accountancy and the Diploma in Taxation qualifications recorded a rise while the Diploma in Public Sector Financial Management qualification maintained its 100% pass rate. The 100% recorded in the Diploma in Public Sector Financial Management qualification was the highest while the lowest pass rate was that recorded in CA Advisory Professional in Accountancy at 27.1%. The Institute is committed to boosting student performance through exam technique workshops, examiners' reports on all subjects and enhanced online study materials. Students are encouraged to fully leverage these resources and engage actively in tuition sessions from our approved tuition providers.

Pass Rates by Gender

Where performance by gender is concerned, it was observed that male candidates out-performed their female counterparts in all levels of the CA Zambia qualification, Diploma in Accountancy level 2 and the Certificate in Taxation. The female candidates were best performers at level 1 of the Diploma in Accountancy and the Diploma in Taxation level. The pass rates by gender were as follows:

- o CA Advisory Professional in Accountancy
- o Diploma in Accountancy (both levels)
- Part-time candidates achieved their best results in:
 - o Diploma in Taxation

- o CA Advisory Professional in Accountancy

Out of the total graduates, forty-nine (49) who completed the CA Advisory Professional in Accountancy qualification are proceeding to or continuing with their supervised practical training, in accordance with the CA Zambia program requirements.

4.0 HIGHEST SCORES AND OVERALL BEST PERFORMING STUDENTS IN RESPECTIVE PROGRAMMES

Allow me now to highlight the highest scores obtained across each of our programmes during the June 2025 examination session. These results are a clear demonstration that with adequate preparation and commitment, our examinations are manageable and rewarding. The following candidates achieved the top marks in their respective qualifications:

4.1 Highest Scores per Programme

• CA Zambia qualification

The highest score on this programme was 90% obtained in CA1.4 - Commercial and Corporate Law at the CA Certificate in Accountancy Level.

• Diploma in Accountancy

The programme had the highest score of 91% obtained in DA3 - Business Economics at level 1.

• Taxation

The programme had the highest score of 85% obtained in C6 - Law for Tax Practitioners at the Certificate level.

• Diploma in Public Sector Financial Management

56% obtained by the lone student that attempted the examination in the programme was the highest. We only had one candidate as the programme is in the process of being phased out.
